WAKE TRIP INITIATOR DUTIES

Definition

A Trip Initiator is a WAKE member who decides that he/she wishes to organize a paddling trip and is willing to invite either WAKE members exclusively, or a combination of WAKE members and non-members to participate. The Trip Initiator is NOT a "tour guide." The Trip Initiator is NOT a paid professional from who is expected a high degree of paddling expertise and who is insured against liability claims. For the purposes of WAKE, a Trip Initiator is a volunteer.

Duties

- 1. The Trip Initiator "advertises" the event through WAKE channels (e.g. email, newsletter, etc.).
- 2. The Trip Initiator will be available to answer basic questions about the intended route, location of the launching and return points, time to arrive, estimated time of return, etc.
- 3. <u>All participants in WAKE paddles MUST have signed a WAKE Liability Waiver before</u> embarking on the paddle. Waivers from organizations other than WAKE are NOT VALID.
 - a) WAKE members who have signed the waiver with their membership application/renewal form do not have to sign another for the trip. [A current membership list may be obtained from a member of the Board of Directors]
 - b) The Trip Initiator should have blank (unsigned) waiver forms at the put-in and obtain signatures from any participant who does not have a signed waiver on file.
 - c) Waivers collected at the put-in must be protected from damage. It is recommended that they be left in the Trip Initiator's vehicle, rather than taken on the paddle.
 - d) Waivers need to be conveyed to the Board of Directors following the event.
- 4. It is not the responsibility of the Trip Initiator to provide equipment, clothing, food, water, or any other items to participants; however, there is no prohibition to the Trip Initiator doing so or to bringing such items as might be useful in an emergency.
- 5. The Trip Initiator should organize or personally conduct a safety briefing and risk assessment prior to launching. Possible topics include: route description; communications; VHF radio protocol; and identifying who has emergency equipment, special skills, or special needs.
- 6. The Trip Initiator is empowered to decide to alter the route, cut short or terminate the paddle, or to decide not to paddle at all.
- 7. The Trip Initiator is empowered to deny participation to paddlers who are unprepared.
